**IV. Club Recognition**

**A. The Croquet Club** was recognized as an official AS Recreational club with \$50 basic funding. ## V. Information Items

**A. Circle K** requested a \$450 grant to help fund the attendance of 10 members at the PNW CKI Fall Conference in Stanwood, November 10-12. This conference allows new and old members of Circle K to get together with other members from across the district to learn more about Circle K and do service projects. The conference offers workshops, guest speakers, and group bonding experiences.

**B. Speed Bike Team** requested a \$1500 underwrite to help pay for incurred costs, materials, and travel costs to participate in a speed bike project. Students will build a Speed Bike with a goal of getting the bike to travel at speeds up to 60 mph. The team will then participate in two competitions in 2007. The funding requested will help cover a portion of the \$4825 needed for this project.

**C. Loa Records** requested a \$450 grant to help fund an on-campus Jason Webley concert. The concert will be held on December 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Underground Coffee House and will be all-ages and free of charge. The funds requested will be used for artist fees and sound system/security and will help cover the \$850 total amount needed.

**D. WWU ACLU-WA** requested a \$200 grant to help fund the movie *The Road to Guantanamo* showing on campus November 30<sup>th</sup> in the Viking Union. This film is a docu-drama which illustrates the United States' policies through extraordinary rendition, torture, and indefinite detention while conducting the global "war on terror." The event is open to all students and the funding requested will help cover the costs to buy the rights of the film and to print big banners to advertise around campus.
