I. Approval of the Minutes

III. Business Director's Report

IV. Club Recognition

A. Japanese Conversation Club, a club whose focus will be in dialogue between native Japanese speakers and ones who have interest in speaking the Japanese language. They want to have this to be able to have an extra curricular setting where the conversation can be practiced. They have already had a few meetings and turn out has been around 12- 13 students. There are no restrictions for people to join, although a knowledge of the language would be very helpful.

V. Information Items

A. Metal and Hardcore, They would like to put on an event on Friday May9th. This will be a second round of a hip hop show done last year. They plan to bring about 3 or 4 people from Seattle and also bring some people in from the Bellingham community. They also hope to have a raffle, and just make this event as good and motivating as possible. They are asking for \$650 underwrite from the council to put this event on.

This will be brought back in two weeks as an action item.

B. Political Science Organization, They are in conjunction with Fairhaven College, the Saturna Lecture Series and the World Issues and Political Science Paths to Global Justice trying to bring Dr. Benjamin Smith to come to campus in March and present two lectures. The first lecture will be at Fairhaven Auditorium at 12:00 on the Kurds. The second lecture will be in Artzen 4 at 2:30 on Oil Politics. Dr. Smith is the author of "*Hard Times in the lands of Plenty: Oil Politics in Iran and Indonesia*" and many other articles. They currently are requesting \$250 underwrite from the council to help cover some of the costs.

This will be brought back in two weeks as an action item.

C. Fairhaven Free Press, They are requesting \$339.29 underwrite to put out first issue of the press. They discussed with the council the different types of articles that will be in the paper. There will be a total of 2,500 black and white copies of the paper that will be distributed primarily on campus and some downtown.

A. Lead, Requesting funds for replacement tools used during work parties in which they plan trees, pick up litter etc... They want to get high quality tools that will last for a couple of years. They are asking for \$510 underwrite for the tools.
