- a. Calling for Repeal of the Higher Education Act Drug Provision – Doc. 1 from 3/6/07**

**VI. Discussion Items**

- a. Issue of the Month**  
Jared prepared six options for the issue of the month. 1 question was added by Brandon. A friendly amendment was made to add Brandon's question to the list of options. Discussion was held between the Senators about all seven questions. Senators could vote on two questions for the first round, the top three questions moved on, and Senators could vote for one of the three. A decision was made for the following question to be question of the month; Dining services is

considering a new meal plan structure for next year. Instead of six different meal plans, which currently range in price from \$694 to \$905, next year there would be only three. Each meal plan would carry a price tag of \$843, but would differ in its ratio of meals and flex points. The first plan would have an unlimited amount of meals with \$100 in Flex Points, the second plan would have 14 meals per week with \$150 in Flex Points, and the third would have 9 meals per week with \$200 in Flex Points. Dining services expects that this revision will allow for greater levels of service, including expanded hours and the possibility of paying for off-campus pizza delivery with Flex Points. How do you feel about this proposal?

**b. Board and Senate Ideas**

Mark Iozzi and Stefan Kalb presented the following ideas, of the ways the Senate came up with to join the Senate and the Board. The first proposal was to take the conference room in the board office and turn it into an office for the Senate Chair. Two desks would be in the office so that other Senators could use the area as well. The second proposal was that instead of having the Senators represent which class they are from, they should represent certain sectors. There would be 2 Senators per sector and they would work along with the Board member from that sector, so that the two groups would be unified. There was very positive input from the Senators about both proposals.

**c. Constitution Revisions**

Grammatical revisions were made to the following articles: 2.2, 2.3, 2.5, 3.3, 3.6, 8.1, 8.1.2, 11, & 12. The following articles were struck from the constitution: 4.2, 8.1.3, & 10. Constitution revisions were completed and the Constitution will be voted on at the following meeting.
